1. Call to Order

 At 7:35 p.m. Bryan Jones called the meeting to order. The meeting was held virtually via Zoom. Present were Bryan Jones, Mike DiSpigno, Marty Sauvage, Keith Zackel, Karen Holderman, and Sarah Messmer.

2. Monthly Board Meeting Date and Time

- Board members decided to meet on the 3rd Thursday of every month at 7:30 pm
- For the first few months of 2021 the meetings will be held via Zoom
- Once the pandemic ends the meetings will likely be moved to Bryan's house

3. Election of 2021 Board Member Positions

- The following board positions were suggested by the group
 - Marty Sauvage continue to serve as Treasurer
 - Mike DiSpigno continue to serve as Vice President
 - Bryan Jones continue to serve as President
 - Sarah Messmer continue to serve as Secretary
 - o Karen Holderman to serve as Board Member At Large
 - Keith Zackel to serve as Board Member At Large
- These positions were approved by the board members at 7:50pm

4. New Business

- The walking trail on Olivia Court continues to flood. Mike asked for the boards approval to spend \$300 to video the drainage system in order investigate the issue
 - The Board approved the expense, the money will be taken out of the Special Projects' budget
- The Tweed Twenty Neighborhood Association technically owns the land south of the houses on McLeod Rd. However, there is a 30ft Right-of-Way between the Tweed Twenty Houses and the McLeod houses that belongs to the county.
 - Mike talked to Doug Rainey about flooding of the ditch that runs through this 30ft Right-of-Way and Doug agreed to bring the topic at a County Meeting on March 3rd
 - Because there is a Right-of-Way that the county doesn't use,
 Tweed Twenty Residents or Overlake Properties (owner of

abandoned property) should technically be responsible for maintaining the ditch that runs through the Right-of-Way. However, Northern Heights Residents are more effected by the ditch flooding and therefore will likely need to do some maintenance on the ditch

- Would be good to get a work party together to clear the ditch especially to help out older neighborhood residents
 - Could likely get Colwell Outdoor Services to cut back the blackberry bushes ahead of time to make the ditch clearing easier
- The remaining trees in the Retention Pond will be cut down this summer
 - Expect the Storm Water Account to be fully funded for this work by April
- Replacing the street lights with LEDs would help save the Association some money in energy costs
 - Karen volunteered to call PSE to see what incentives they are offering to switch street lights over to LEDs. Marty thinks there may be a rebate program in place
 - There are 17 street lights left to be converted to LEDs

4. End of Meeting

- A motion to adjourn the meeting was made, and seconded. The meeting ended at 8:10 p.m.
